Report on academic progress from Academic Achievement Committee

- iReady monthly usage
 - Upward trend; on track for targeted goal.
- Lexia monthly usage
 - Similar upward trend
 - Skill status, seeing progress in above grade level. Slight increase in below grade level.
 Slight decrease in at-grade level students.
- iReady data
 - Looking at correlation to proficiency on MCA
 - o iReady overall performance k-8 from fall to winter
 - Improving; significant growth for students in mid-above grade level band. Also saw decreases in students who were two+ grade levels below.
 - In general, students farther behind are making the most growth.
 - Encouraging trends, happy with curriculum.
 - NECP goals for iReady growth:
 - 100% of students will meet expected growth; 50% will meet stretch growth goals.
 - Strong growth trends in data.
- FAST Data
 - Seeing growth in median scores; not showing as shifts in levels yet.

Update on distance learning

- Previous recommendation: stay in distance learning with supports for high-needs students.
- Added some students; dependent on staffing capacity
 - At around 12% of students in school now; moving to 15% soon
- Summer school program
- After school program for students who are behind academically
- Hennepin County COVID Data; numbers were coming down significantly in January, but still above 30
 - o Current data: 18.1 Hennepin County; 14.6 Minneapolis
 - Reopening of state has not caused state numbers to increase
- Vaccinations underway
- Decrease in cases in the community has been consistent with the in-person program
 - No student days lost to quarantining
- Next steps:
 - Survey families in next 2 weeks
 - o Survey staff by March 17th
 - o Recommendation 3/21 for 3/23 Meeting
